

Year 6 Spring Term 2



English:

Next half term we will look at the famous explorers, Shackleton and Robert Falcon Scott, and their brave journeys to the Antarctic. We will create own heroic characters for their own creative stories using a variety of the Year 6 grammar and punctuation.

Maths:

In maths, we will be moving onto area, perimeter and volume as well as continuing to revise their arithmetic skills with the four operations.

Guided Reading:

We will continue to develop our comprehension skills in by using our retrieval, inference and vocabulary skills across a range of genres and texts.

Science:

We will be diving into classification of animals. Children will learn how to use classification keys to identify living things including micro-organisms. We will also explore the usefulness of bacteria and how organisms have adapted to their habitat.

Our topic for the next 2 half terms is:

Frozen Kingdom



How does the pole's climate affect us?

Geography

We will plot polar regions on a world map and research the differences between the Arctic and the Antarctic, as well as delving into the world of tourism. We will also revisit biomes and children will create their own biome in a box!

Hook

The children are going to watch videos of the arctic and different explorers. We will then imagine we are about to embark on an arctic mission. Who would they take? What would they take? We will complete some science experiments on how to stay warm in the freezing cold!

Music

We will be appraising 'You've Got a Friend' in music. They will be listening, improvising and composing within the unit.

PSHE:

Our next unit for PSHE will focus on health and wellbeing. They will learn about healthy eating, drugs and gangs and taking care of their emotions and mental health.

PE

In PE, the children will be developing their footwork and agility skills. They will develop this through a variety of non-traditional games and healthy competition.

Art:

Children will be creating artwork inspired by the Inuits, using their sketching skills, then building upon their ideas to create a final printed piece of artwork.

Computing:

We will be using different a range of Office and Outlook programs on our 1:1 devices. This will include the creation of a PowerPoint presentation to show our learning.

RE:

We will be learning about the concept of resurrection. We will explore this whilst looking at the Christian Faith.

Reading:
