As part of the Thinking Schools Academy Trust, New Horizons Primary School takes pride in the unique approach we take to education: we provide our children with the skills and tools they need to think in a variety of ways and become lifelong learners. We believe that the best way to transform the life chances of our young people and help them achieve their aspirations is by shaping their minds, attitudes and habits through a framework of cognitive education that enables them to become the masters of their own destiny.

Our pupils are equipped with a bank of Thinking Tools designed to prepare them for a range of scenarios, dilemmas, and circumstances that they may face in life as part of modern society. The use of these Tools in our curriculum is supported by scientific and metacognitive research, and pupils are encouraged to apply their tools independently and use them to unlock new ideas. Our Thinking Tools include Thinking Maps, De Bono's Thinking Hats and Art Costa's Habits of Mind. These tools are used consistently across all areas of our curriculum and support our children tremendously in their learning and personal growth.

The concept of 'Being your Best Self' is also at the heart of our approach to learning at New Horizons Primary School as part of our Thinking School ethos. Children are encouraged to strive to be and achieve their best and are given multiple opportunities to reflect on their learning and work on their personal development.

A Nurturing and Safe Environment

Children learn best when they are in an environment which makes them feel happy and safe. We pride ourselves on our high-quality learning environment which is calm, purposeful and promotes children's independence.

There are high expectations of behaviour and everyone in the school community has a responsibility for maintaining a relaxed, calm and happy atmosphere. We recognise that all behaviour is communication and that sometimes children need support to make the right choices. Throughout the school, we will nurture children's social development, to support them to recognise and deal effectively with the different emotions they will experience. Through our school values we will equip our children with the skills which will enable them to be polite, confident, hard working members of society.

New Horizons Primary school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects staff and volunteers to share in this commitment. Staff work hard to maintain an environment where children feel safe and secure.

The curriculum is designed to ensure opportunities for children to develop the skills they need to recognise and stay safe from abuse. Children know they can approach any of the adults in school if they are worried and that they will receive a consistent supportive response.







Our Learning Heroes

At New Horizons Primary School, we understand that learning is lifelong. We aim to develop children's self-awareness of how they learn and nurture positive attitudes to learning. We equip children with a language for learning that is used in all classrooms across the school, this helps everyone to talk about and understand learning to learn. Each class has four learning heroes, which are fun characters that represent four learning skills: resilience, resourcefulness, reciprocity and reflectiveness.

We know that learning habits are vital for success. We grow 16 'habits of mind' which help children to become effective thinkers. These are based on the work of Art De Costa. In the Early Years, we focus on 5 of these;

Persisting; Questioning; Communicating clearly; Exploring with Wonder; and Thinking Interdependently.







ALL THROUGH EDUCATION AT THINKING SCHOOLS ACADEMY TRUST

In Portsmouth, we have created a unique offer for parents; the chance for your child to experience an 'all through' educational journey where they stay with the same family of schools.

We have a number of infant/junior and all-through primaries in the city and our secondary school – The Portsmouth Academy. Each of our schools has adapted their admissions policies so that parents get a priority preference, when applying for a place in another thinking school.

To accommodate children in the primary phase carrying their journey on, we changed The Portsmouth Academy into a co-educational school and increased the number of places in Year 7 from 200 to 250, investing millions into new facilities to support these changes.

All-through education has many potential benefits for your child. First and foremost, our multi-academy Trust does have a shared approach to teaching children, a language of learning that is taught and then built upon. This consistency helps to accelerate children's progress as they understand what to do, and how to do it. Indeed, developing metacognition right from the early years has been shown to have a massive effect on young people's learning capacity. In addition, the familiarity is reassuring and helps make changing schools easier.

Secondly, our teachers and leaders work really closely together. This means we can design a curriculum that builds on what children already know. Our experienced Headteachers work very closely together to identify and implement strategies that we know will make a massive difference to children's progress in school, confidence and well-being. We are innovative and forward-thinking and work with the local authority to both share our good practice, and also to learn from others beyond our Multi-Academy Trust.

Children see us moving between schools and the continuation of our relationships with them helps them to feel a sense of belonging, security and of being looked after.
